Oregon Revised Statute 190

Intergovernmental Cooperation

ORS 190.003, <u>Unit of local Government</u>, (County, City, District, or other public corporation, commission, authority or entity) organized and existing under statute or city or county charter. ORS 190.07, <u>Policy</u>, In the interest of furthering economy and efficiency in local government, intergovernmental cooperation is declared a matter of statewide concern. The provisions of ORS 190.003 to ORS 190.130 shall be <u>liberally construed</u>.



Authority to Make IGA's

ORS 190.010

A unit of local government may enter into a written agreement with any other unit or units of local government for the performance of any or all functions and activities that a party to the agreement, its officers or agencies, have authority to perform.



Examples

ORS 190.010

The agreement may provide for the performance of a function or activity:

- By a consolidated department
- By jointly providing for administrative officers
- By means of facilities or equipment jointly constructed, owned, leased or operated
- By one of the parties for any other party



Examples

By an intergovernmental entity created by the agreement and governed by a board or commission appointed by, responsible to and acting on behalf of the units of local government that are parries to the agreement.

By a combination of the methods described in this section



Contents of Agreement ORS 190.020

Specify the functions or activities to be performed and by what means they shall be performed.

Responsibility for providing funds to pay for expenses incurred in the performance of the functions or activities.

Apportionment of fees or other revenue derived from the functions or activities and manner in which such revenue shall be accounted for.



Contents of Agreement ORS 190.020

Transfer of personnel and the preservation of their employment benefits.

Term and duration of the agreement, which may be perpetual.

The rights of the parties to terminate the agreement.



Termination of Agreement

ORS 190.020 (2)

When the parties to an agreement are unable, upon termination of the agreement, to agree on the transfer of personnel or the division of assets and liabilities between the parties, the circuit court has jurisdiction to determine that transfer or division. (1967)



Effect of Agreement

ORS 190.030

Vest all powers relating to the functions or activities granted in the agreement.

Officer holds only one office under agreement.

Elective office may not be terminated by an agreement.
