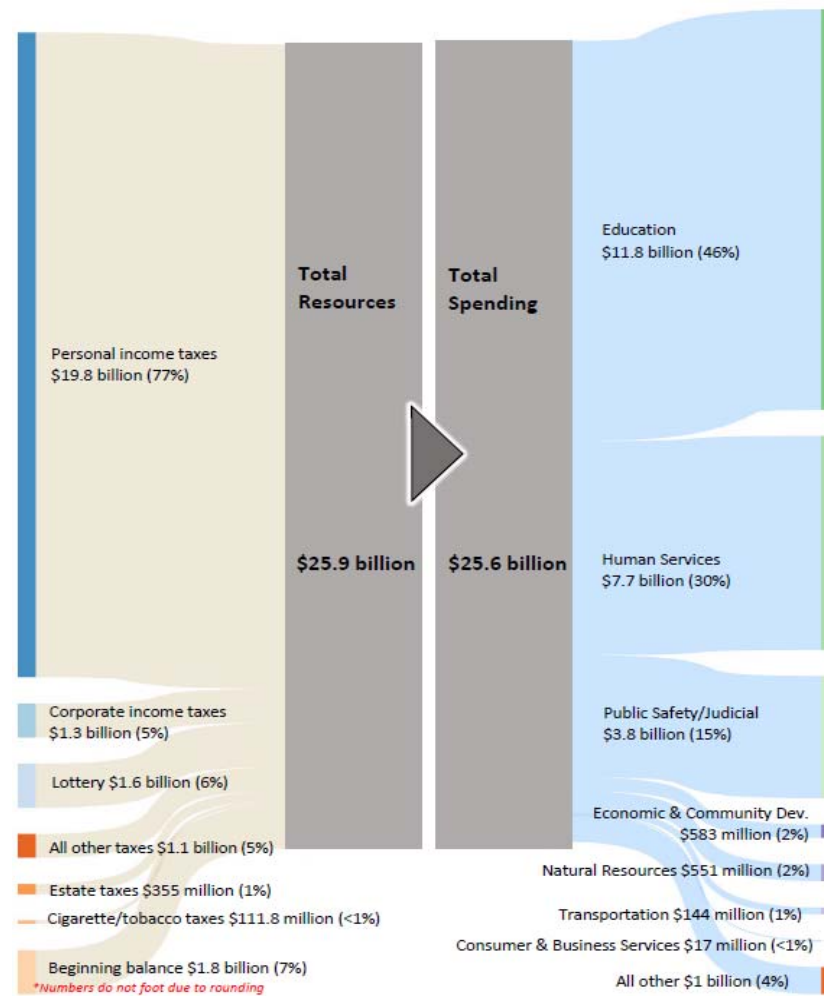
Governor's 2021 Priorities

- No State of the State speech given by Governor Brown as of the time of this recording – January 19th
- Securing additional Federal Assistance
- COVID-19 response – vaccination roll-out and resuming in-person schooling
- Wildfire response and mitigation
- Racial and Environmental Justice
- Affordable housing and homelessness

Significant Issues for 2021 Session

- Balancing the state budget - job number one.
- Continued COVID relief – if as expected the federal government provides additional stimulus funding to the state. This will have a significant impact to the state's budget.
- Wildfire mitigation, planning, and rebuilding.
- Police Reform
- Racial and Environmental Justice issues

We have heard that upwards of 3,200 Legislative Counsel requests had been submitted prior to session beginning.

As of January 19th, 1,804 bills have made public. We anticipate another 1,000 as early as 21st will be made public.
